Mission: The Adelson School is Proudly Jewish, Proudly Zionist, Proudly American, and Proudly Classical. Our adherence to these four pillars supports the growth of courageous, capable, college-ready leaders that graduate knowing who they are, where they came from, and why they are important.

Facilities: The 14-acre campus features state-of-the-art classrooms; science labs; a library; art studios and a music hall; a performing arts theater; a spacious dining commons and patio; a 5,000 sq ft technology, engineering, and business incubator; a swimming pool; an indoor track; tennis courts; and a soccer field.

School Community: We are a pluralistic day school in which Friday morning Shabbat services and Jewish holiday observance enrich our community. As part of our commitment to a drug-free environment, randomly-timed drug tests of all faculty, staff, and students (Grades 7-12) are conducted.

Admission: Selective, but not exclusive. Approximately two-thirds of the student body is Jewish.

Student Body: Class of 2026: 38 graduates. Enrollment in grades 9-12: 100 students.

Daily Schedule: Modified block schedule. The school day consists of eight 45 minute classes, Monday through Wednesday, with four 80 minute rotating block periods on Thursdays and Fridays.

Grading and Class Rank: The school operates on a semester system. Year-long courses earn 1.0 credit; semester courses earn 0.5 credit. GPA includes all courses except Physical Education. Weighted and unweighted GPAs are reported on transcripts. Quality points are awarded for Honors (0.5) and AP courses (1.0) for a grade of C+ or higher. Students are not ranked.

Graduation: All graduates earn admission to four-year colleges and universities. Acceptances from the past four years include Brown, Cornell, Duke, Emory, Georgetown, MIT, Olin, Pomona, Renssalaer Polytechnic Institute, University of Michigan, University of Virginia, USC, and Vanderbilt.

Membership/Accreditation: The School is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC) and the Northwest Association of Independent Schools (NWAIS); the School is a member of the National Association of Independent Schools (NAIS) and the National Association of College Admission Counseling (NACAC).
